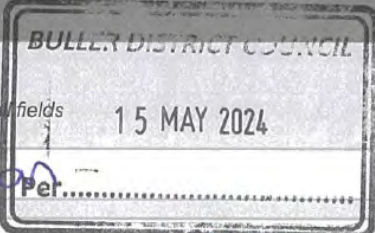

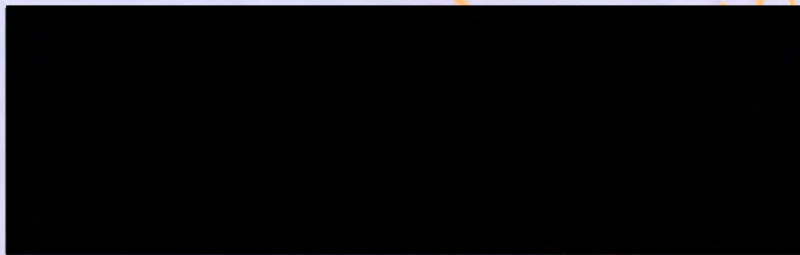

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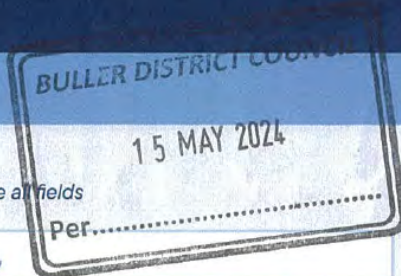

Continuance of this financial support is necessary to service this facility and an increase to \$3000 per annum would be appreciated.



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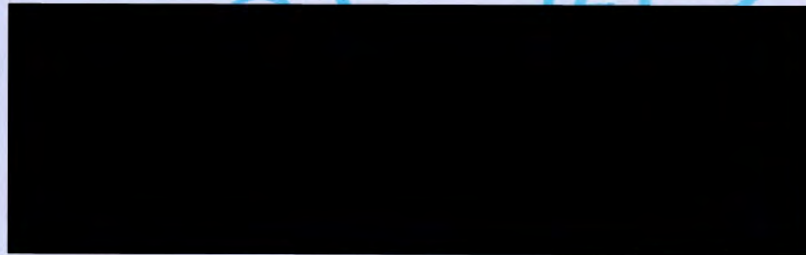

The reasons I'm opposed to any Rates Rise in the Buller District Council are as follows

- 1 The rates are already far too high and the Council has admitted to this in public on one or more occasions.
2. There are Council Workers in Reefton that do very little during their work day except drive around doing nothing and thinking they are fooling everyone.
- 3 There are jobs around town that need doing regularly and they aren't being done as often as they should.
 - The Water Ways are clogged with weeds, some are more than 2 feet high
 - The drains need cleaning, so that when it rains the water will drain away and not leave puddles that cover half the street
 - The parks and other council grass areas should be mowed weekly and they aren't
- 4 I have heard myself and other people around town complaining about the Foreman in Reefton. He seems to find it hard to find work for his staff. And I don't think I have ever seen him do any serious work.
- 5 The vehicles are constantly breaking down, Lack regular and proper of service.
- 6 We pay for Waste Management in our rates and yet the Council Dump is also one of the most expensive in New Zealand.
A lot of people are refusing to use the Council dump and so they dump their rubbish (not just green waste) where ever they want.
- 7 The cost of Council Rubbish Bags at the Supermarket is outrageous

8 There are a lot of dogs in Reefton, Some households have 2 or more dogs. Some people look after their dogs yet others let their dogs bark from dawn to dusk or longer. Others seem to not care if their dog is found wandering round town unsupervised, defecating where ever.

The Dog Ranger is 90 minutes away and has a hard time imposing any penalties on repeat offenders and their owners who don't follow the rules

No increase in rates should be approved at this point.

Before this submission is contemptuously discarded, Council must consider the plight of overcharged ratepayers.

Council staff and councillors are very well paid by ratepayers, many (perhaps the majority) of whom are of very modest means with no ability to pass on the charges. The Buller rating district is the least able in the country to afford a large council staff, being few in number and poor in substance.

Central government has set the standard by requiring that staff be significantly reduced in all areas. The various departments must bite the bullet and find ways to make do with fewer employees.

Buller District Council has a responsibility to do likewise. It is supposed to represent the interests of the community. Effectively, it is killing the community through its own greed and stupidity. How many forced sales of people's homes will it take before the community rebels completely. 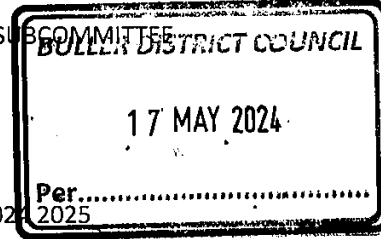

Re: Buller District Enhanced Annual Plan 2024

The Waimangaroa Reserve & Hall Subcommittee wishes to submit its case for a grant of \$39795.64 to enable the subcommittee to complete the first stage of the redevelopment of the Domain building in accordance with the building consent on file with Buller District Council.

The brief background to this project is as follows.

Prior to the reconstitution of what used to be the Waimangaroa Domain Board into the Waimangaroa Reserve & Hall Subcommittee, the Committee (as it was then known) prepared plans and obtained quotes for renovating the building. The first stage was for the installation of a new kitchen and toilets in order that the facility might be used to generate income to pay towards the completion of the renovation of the entire building – inside and out. It was expected that funding would be available from an outside source.

At that time Council did not support the project and the Committee shelved it.

Following the inauguration of the Provincial Growth Fund, Council adopted the project and submitted to the Fund the quotes which had been obtained and a grant of \$146,000 was received.

From this grant the renovation was begun and almost finished.

However, one of the builders departed from the brief and stripped out the entire building, necessitating considerable expense and compliance issues to get the building to the stage of a Certificate of Public Use being able to be issued.

It is for this work that the grant sought is required.

Invoices from B W Palmer Ltd (\$552.00), Mitre10 (\$1966.26), Buller Refrigeration & Electrical Ltd (\$11510.98) Buller Plumbing Ltd (\$5115 plus gst for stage I and \$13821 plus gst for stage II)

A PC sum only has had to be supplied for Gib stopping and minor electrical work because the plasterer approached advised he was not prepared to give a quote and it will be necessary to find another tradesman. However, the work is urgent and cannot be deferred.

It should be noted that a small (very small) number of volunteers have provided many hours of work – much of it highly skilled work - painting, sanding and building to get the building to its present state and have also run successful, but quite labour-intensive fundraising

projects from which it has been possible to pay for carpeting the room, thanks, in part, to a very generously discounted price from Bradleys' Furniture & Furnishings. They have also planted trees to kick-start the restoration of the land to create a worthy reserve.

 When preparing this enhanced annual plan, Council submitted a programme of works to Waka Kotahi NZTA for inclusion in the National Land Transport Programme (NLTP). This is partly due to changes within the new government's Policy Statement for land transport.
